**Call for Workshop Proposals**

The Campus Program is seeking presenters for its Summer Training & Technical Assistance Institute (TTI), to be held June 16-17, 2010, in Las Vegas, Nevada. Conference workshops will address a wide range of topics organized into separate conference tracks. Workshops are scheduled for either 90 minutes (1.5 hours) or 180 minutes (3 hours) in length, unless otherwise specified in the proposal. Accepted presenters will be assigned a time slot by the Campus Program staff.

**2010 Summer TTI Overview**

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women in collaboration with CALCASA are pleased to present the Summer Training & Technical Assistance Institute (TTI) 2010. The institute will emphasize a multidisciplinary approach to sharing promising practices, current research, and effective programs and policies that are victim-centered, practice-based, and research-informed. The Summer TTI will serve a forum for law enforcement, victim service professionals, allied practitioners, policymakers, and researchers to share current developments and build new collaborations. In addition, non-campus grantees from across the U.S. and territories will gather.

**Potential Conference Tracks**

We anticipate more than 500 participants and have planned plenary sessions, breakout workshops, and networking activities. Potential areas of interest are listed on this form.

**Qualifications for Presenting**

Speakers may NOT promote their own products or services during the presentation. Conference presenters may include educators, victim advocates, counselors, attorneys, social workers, law enforcement personnel and other criminal justice providers, psychologists, researchers, students, and community leaders—*anyone who is actively involved in helping survivors of sexual assault, domestic/dating violence, and/or stalking.*

**Selection Criteria**

Workshop proposals will be reviewed and selected by OVW and CALCASA. Final selections will be based on the educational content of the session, the uniqueness of the presentation, the suitability for the audience, the speaker’s expertise with the subject matter, and how well the workshop incorporates or informs the theme of the conference. Presenters are strongly encouraged to use a victim-centered, practice-based, research-informed approach.

## **SAMPLE PROPOSAL**

### **Sample Session Description**

#### A Group Approach for Adolescents Experiencing Traumatic Grief

Group intervention is a promising practice for adolescents who have experienced the death of someone close to them due to violence or who have witnessed violent death firsthand. This workshop will review traumatic reactions, explore current research, and present a ten-week grief and trauma group model designed specifically for adolescents experiencing traumatic grief.

### **Sample Presenter Bio**

Jane Smith, PhD

Dr. Smith is a licensed clinical psychologist with a practice specializing in supporting children and families affected by violence and loss. She is the author of *Reactions*, a workbook specifically for children experiencing grief and trauma, and *Group Work with Adolescents after Violent Death: A Manual for Practitioners*. Dr. Smith has published numerous articles and provided presentations for local, state, and national groups on helping children after violent death.

### **Sample Educational Objectives**

1. To understand how traumatic reactions may interfere with bereavement during adolescence.
2. To identify critical logistics for conducting grief and trauma groups.
3. To learn about a ten-week grief and trauma group intervention format designed specifically for adolescents.

### **Sample Teaching Methods**

Teaching methods will include lecture, case examples with artwork, question and answers, and facilitated discussion. After covering information pertaining to each objective, the presenter will solicit participation from attendees by facilitating questions and discussion. To highlight activities used in the ten-week group, presenters will conduct two experiential exercises for those attendees who wish to participate.
