a **systematic** process that **promotes** healthy **environments** and behaviors and reduces the likelihood of an incident, condition, or injury **before** it occurs in the first place. (from Prevention Institute, www.preventioninstitute.org)

- Knowledge → Attitudes → Beliefs → Behaviors ????
- Expectations, Social Desirability, Modeling, Media
- Enforce, Educate, Market/Persuade

Social Marketing Principles:

- Understand Primary Audience
- Define Desired Behavior
- Identify Benefits of Adopting Behavior
- Identify Barriers to Adopting Behavior / Competition
- Ease to Implement Behavior
- Communication Strategy
- Mobilize
- Create Social Norms
