CALCASA awarded grant to establish “Unifying Fields”

Project will strengthen link between domestic and sexual violence in California

SACRAMENTO, Calif.—December 17, 2012—The California Coalition Against Sexual Assault (CALCASA) has been granted an award to implement Unifying Fields: Building Linkages Between Domestic Violence and Sexual Violence.

“This first-time funding will enable CALCASA to convene dual sexual assault and domestic violence service providers to identify areas of intersection between these issues. Unifying Fields seeks to strengthen the capacity of dual programs around the state to develop and implement an integration strategy, ultimately leading to more comprehensive service delivery for sexual assault and domestic violence survivors” said Sandra Henriquez, CALCASA’s executive director.

“The Partnership looks forward to collaborating with CALCASA to support our dual member organizations,” said Tara Shabazz, executive director of the California Partnership to End Domestic Violence. “We hope that this project will deepen relationships among local programs and strengthen the institutional ties between our sister coalitions, so that we can all better meet the needs of California survivors and communities.”
